Maine High Adventure is a challenging outdoor program offered by the Boy Scouts of America. Each summer hundreds of Scouts and Venture Crews enjoy unique backcountry experiences in northern Maine. The area encompasses Mount Katahdin, the Allagash Waterway, a portion of the Appalachian Trail and the Penobscot watershed – more than 10,000 square miles of the north Maine woods which remains much as Henry David Thoreau saw it 140 years ago. A highly trained MHA guide is assigned to help each crew enjoy a successful adventure.

Troop 100 did this adventure in 2003, and it was great. We went for days without seeing any other travelers on the river. There are many trip options of varying challenge levels. You'll get to walk in forests that have never had a human footstep before. You'll get to see wildlife that you've only seen in a zoo.

This trip is particularly attractive because it has a very low age limit, and, because travel costs are minimal, a very low cost.
